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The Governor appointed this special commission in 1965 at the request of the General Assembly to make a comprehensive study and review of the criminal laws of the State, criminal procedures and the administration of criminal justice. A volume containing a Report and Part I of a Proposed Criminal Code was published in June of 1972 and circulated among the Bench, Bar and interested public for study and comment. Part II of the Proposed Criminal Code is in the process of preparation. The Proposed Criminal Code and the Commission's Report will be presented to the Legislature later for its consideration (J. R. No. 22, Acts of 1965).
