<sup>56</sup> Consists of 5 members. One represents the Baltimore Museum of Art and 1 the Baltimore Chapter of the American Institute of Architects. One must be a professional engineer, 1 an artist or teacher of art, and 1 represents the general public. Members serve 4-year terms. A member of the Department of Public Works also serves ex officio.

<sup>57</sup> Appointed by the Mayor for 5-year terms. The Mayor, the City Solicitor and the Chairman of the Civil Service Commission serve ex officio.

<sup>58</sup> Consists of 11 members appointed by the Mayor for 5-year terms (Ordinance 229, May 1964). The Commission selects the Executive Secretary.

<sup>59</sup> Consists of 18 members (Res. 787, 1965). This Commission will put into operation a conciliation court similar to that in California which has been highly successful. The plan has been approved by the Supreme Bench of Baltimore City and the rules have been published in the *Daily Record*. Financing the project is in process, and when that has been completed, the court will be in full operation in conjunction with the Circuit Court No. 2 of Baltimore City wherein domestic matters are processed and heard.

<sup>60</sup> Established by Executive Order in June 1960. The Committee consists of 8 members. The Director is appointed by the Mayor.

<sup>61</sup> Consists of 5 members appointed by the Mayor for 3-year terms. The Commission appoints the Director.

\* Term expired. Continues to serve until reappointed or successor chosen.

<sup>62</sup> Appointed by the Mayor with the approval of the Board of Estimates. There is a Citizens Advisory Board composed of the Directors and Chairmen of the six Model Cities Community Councils.

<sup>63</sup> Composed of 8 members, 7 appointed by specific institutions with the consent of the Mayor and City Council for 4-year terms, 1 ex officio.

<sup>64</sup> The Board of Trustees is self-perpetuating. The Board appoints the Director.

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
