The Governor's Advisory Commission on Student Affairs for the University of Mary-

land, College Park Campus was created by Executive Order in 1976. The Commission consists of fifteen members appointed by the Governor from the student body at the University of Maryland, College Park for one year terms. Seven of the members represent various campus organizations including the Black Student Union, the Chancellor's Graduate Student Advisory Council, the Interfraternity Council, the Panhellenic Council, the Residence Hall Association, the Student Government Association, and the University Commuters Association. Eight members are chosen at large. The Governor's Education Officer serves as liaison between the Governor and the Commission.

The Governor appointed this Task Force at the request of the General Assembly to study the functions of the Board of Public Works for the purpose of consolidating or modifying its responsibilities. The Task Force consists of three members who represent the Executive Branch of the State government, two appointed by the President of the Senate, two appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates, and two from the public at large. The Task Force is to report its findings by January 1, 1977 (Res. No. 27, Acts of 1976).
