The Maryland Legal Services Corporation was established in 1982 (Chapter 829, Acts of 1982). The Corporation receives and distributes funds to grantees that provide legal assistance to eligible clients in noncriminal proceedings or matters. The Corporation ensures that grants and contracts are made so as to provide the most stable, economical, and effective delivery of legal assistance. It also ensures that eligible clients in all areas of the State have access to the Corporation's services.

The Corporation establishes maximum income levels for client eligibility. These are based on a client's financial inability to pay for competent private counsel and other necessary expenses of representation. The maximum income levels for eligibility set by the Corporation may not exceed 50 percent of the median family income for the State of Maryland, as certified annually by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The Corporation is governed by a Board of Directors. The Board consists of five lawyer and four non-lawyer members appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. Board members serve three-year terms. The Board appoints the Executive Director who serves ex officio as a nonvoting member of the Board (Code 1957, Art. 10, secs. 45A through 45-0).

The Corporation publishes an annual report and a brochure which describe its services. These are available upon request.
