In 1973, the Maryland Veterans Commission was authorized to acquire sites for cemeteries for Maryland veterans honorably discharged from the Armed Forces of the United States, and the members of their immediate families (Chapter 504, Acts of 1973). Funds appropriated were authorized in 1974 to be used for the development of cemeteries rather than the acquisition of sites, since State land was to be used (Chapter 775, Acts of 1974).

Through its Cemetery Program, the Commission has responsibility for the establishment, acquisition, supervision and control of cemeteries, and for requirements for eligibility for burial. The Commission also maintains a permanent registry of graves of all persons who served in the military or naval forces of the country in time of war and who are buried in Maryland (Code State Government Article, secs. 9-904 through 9-914). The five veterans' cemeteries located in Maryland are in Allegany, Anne Arundel, Baltimore, Dorchester, and Prince George's counties (Code State Government Article, secs. 9-913 through 9-914).
