a State permit or license (Code 1957, Art. 83B, secs. 5-616 through 5-619).

The Council is comprised of seven members. Three are appointed by the Governor. Of these, two must have expertise in history, archeology, or other appropriate disciplines relating to historic preservation, and the third represents the public. Four members serve ex officio: the Secretary of General Services, the Secretary of Housing and Community Development, the Secretary of Transportation, and the Director of Planning. The Secretary of Housing and Community Development is designated chair-person.
