Two student members serve two-year terms. Every two years, the Governor designates the chairperson (Code 1957, Art. 49D, secs. 21-27).

Under the federal Education of the Handicapped Act (P.L. 99-457), funds are allotted for Maryland to provide early intervention services statewide for handicapped infants and toddlers, from birth through two years of age, and their families. In 1988 the State Department of Education was designated by the Governor to administer the federal early intervention program in Maryland (Executive Order 01.01.1988.15). In 1990, the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program was transferred to the Office for Children, Youth, and Families (Chapter 419, Acts of 1990).

The Maryland State Interagency Coordinating Council was established by the Governor for the Maryland Infants and Toddlers Program in 1988 in accordance with amendments to the federal Education of the Handicapped Act (P.L. 99-457; Executive Order 01.01.1988.15). In 1990, the Council was authorized by statute (Chapter 419, Acts of 1990).

The Council helps develop and implement the early intervention program and assists with interagency agreements and the identification of resources. The Council also serves as an advisory board

for the program. To ensure interagency coordination and delivery of early intervention services, the Governor's Subcabinet for Children, Youth, and Families monitors the program.

The Council's fifteen members are appointed by the Governor with Senate advice and consent.
