QUESTION NO. 1

CIVIL & MILITARY OFFICE

PROPOSED BY CHAPTER 61, ACTS OF 1990

Allows State and local officials, including legislators and judges, to serve at the same time as a member of a reserve component of the United States armed forces or as a member of the federal or State militia.

QUESTION NO. 2

COURT CLERKS & EMPLOYEES; JUDICIARY BUDGET

PROPOSED BY CHAPTER 62, ACTS OF 1990

Provides that Circuit Court Clerks' offices are to be governed by rules adopted by the State's highest court, rather than by local judges, and makes certain personnel decisions in these offices subject to procedures set by law; provides for certification of the Judiciary's budget by the Chief Judge of the highest court, rather than by the Comptroller.
