The Board of Trustees of the Maryland Teachers and State Employees Supplemental Retirement Plans was created in 1985 to administer the State's supplemental retirement plans (Chapter 741, Acts of 1985). These voluntary plans for tax-sheltered income deferral, tax-deferred annuity, profit sharing, and salary reduction enable State employees and teachers to secure tax advantages.

The Board consists of nine members appointed by the Governor. Three are appointed from any of the following agencies: Department of Budget and Fiscal Planning; State Department of Education; Department of Personnel; Comptroller of the Treasury; State Treasurer; State Retirement Agency; or Maryland Higher Education Commission. Three are appointed who are eligible to participate in one or more of the supplemental retirement plans. Three are public members not eligible to participate in any plan. At least one public member must have experience with deferred com-

pensation and salary reduction plans. Members serve four-year terms. The Governor designates the chairperson (Code 1957, Art. 73C, secs. 1-8).
