A bill entitled an Act to refund Alexander Brown & Sons, of the city of Baltimore, Agents of Brown, Shipley & Co., of London, the sum of fifty-eight pounds, sixteen shillings and ten pence in gold, amounting in currency to four hundred dollars and ninety cents, for money erroneously paid by them into the Treasury on or about the 1st of July, 1867.
