Endorsed, "Passed by year and nays, with proposed amendments."

On motion of Mr. McLane,

Indefinitely postponed.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bills:

The bill entitled an Act to enable the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to endorse or guarantee the first mortgage bonds of the Maryland Central Railroad Company to the amount of six hundred thousand dollars.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Baltimore city delegation.

The bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to provide a suitable portrait of the late Gov. Thomas G. Pratt, to be placed in the Executive Chamber.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.
