Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the following bill:

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 28, of Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Licenses to Foreign Insurance Companies, and re-enact the same with amendments, so as to read as follows,
