

Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Merrick, (the rules being suspended,) The House proceeded to the consideration of bills entitled to a second reading.

Mr. Sanner moved a suspension of the rules, and that the House proceed to the consideration of the Pension bill.

Decided in the negative.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 555, 557, 558, 559, 560, 561, 562, 563, 564, of Article 4, of the Public Local Laws of Baltimore city, entitled "Wood," and also to repeal chapter 116, passed January session 1862, relating to inspection and cording of fire wood in Baltimore city,

Was read a third time, and

On motion of Mr. Harrington,

The further consideration thereof was postponed, and the bill made the order of the day for Thursday, the 31st inst.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the bill entitled an Act providing for the sale of the property of the President and Visitors of the Maryland Hospital in Baltimore city, and for the removal of said Hospital to Spring Grove, in Baltimore county, and for the transfer of said Spring Grove property to the said President and Visitors,

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays with proposed amendments."

The amendments were read.

Mr. Merrick moved to non-concur in the proposed Senate amendments.

Mr. McCreery moved to concur in the Senate amendments.

Decided in the negative.

The question then recurring upon the motion submitted by Mr. Merrick,

It was decided in the affirmative, and the Senate amendments non-concurred in.
