The House then proceeded to the consideration of the next order of the day,

Being the bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 555, 557, 558, 559, 560, 561, 562, 563, 564, of Article 4, of the Public Local Laws of Baltimore city, entitled "Wood," and also to repeal chapter 116, passed January session 1862, relating to inspection and cording of fire wood in Baltimore city.
