

On motion of Mr. Gatch,

The further consideration thereof was postponed, and the bill recommitted to the Select Committee on that subject.

Mr. Gatch, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act, passed January session, 1868, chapter 104, appropriating a sum of money to remove the Confederate dead to Antietam National Cemetery, and in lieu thereof to enact the following.
