The bill entitled an Act to legalize a supplement to the Maryland Code, containing the Acts of the General Assembly, passed at the sessions of 1861, 1861, 1862, 1864, 1865, 1866 and 1867, arranged in Articles and sections to correspond with the Code by Lewis Mayer, and to appropriate a sum of money to purchase copies of the same, and to regulate their distribution,

Was read a third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
