Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill repealing and re-enacting with amendments, the law relating to Cording of Wood in Baltimore city.

Mr. McLane submitted the following Joint Resolution :

*Be it Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Librarian be authorized to extend the use of the Library to the Judges of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel county, during the sessions of said Court, at Annapolis.*

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Touchstone, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably a bill entitled an Act granting the assent of the General Assembly of Maryland to a bequest of a legacy made in the last will and testament of Josias Ramsey, late of Cecil county, deceased, to the Trustees of the Methodist Protestant Church at New Leeds, in Cecil county.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Biddle, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably a bill entitled an Act to repeal Chapter 295, Act of Assembly, 1868, entitled an Act to amend Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Guano," by adding thereto the following sections relating to the inspection of all fertilizers other than guano, and to substitute the following in lieu thereof.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Loker, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably a bill entitled an Act for the protection of fish in the tributaries of the Potomac river, lying in St. Mary's county, and to regulate the time and manner of catching and taking fish in that portion of the Potomac river between Cobb Point, in Charles county, and Point Lookout, in St. Mary's county

Which was read a first time, and on motion of Mr. Loker referred to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries.
