AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend sections two and three by striking out the same, and inserting in lieu thereof the following :

Section 6. *And be it enacted*, That a license may be granted to any person who may apply for permission to keep a billiard table, for which license there shall be paid the sum of fifty dollars, and that for every additional billiard table kept by the same person or persons, he, she or they shall pay a license of twenty-five dollars; *provided*, that all said addi-
