Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

Mr. Hoblitzell submitted the following order:

Ordered, That Grafton Duvall, the Journal Clerk, be allowed his per diem for the time—not exceeding six days—he may be engaged in correcting the Journal after the adjournment of the House.

Which was adopted.

On motion of Mr. Merrick,

The vote by which the Senate bill entitled an Act to pay M. A. Newell the sum of six hundred and twenty dollars for clerical assistance hired by him to aid in preparing two annual reports upon the condition of the public schools of the State was rejected for want of a constitutional majority, was reconsidered.
