On motion by Mr. Grove, and by unanimous consent, it was

Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal, that if the Senator representing Washington county had been present when the vote was taken on the amendment offered by the Senator from Baltimore city, proposing a later day for the election of Treasurer, he would have voted in the affirmative.

On motion by Mr. Spates,

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of Executive business, and after a time resumed the consideration of the Legislative business.

On motion by Mr. Clarke, and by unanimous consent,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings to introduce a bill to repeal section 2 of the Act of 1867, chapter 329, respecting the drawing of Jurors in Baltimore-county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

On motion by Mr. Clarke,

The Senate adjourned.
