Which was read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

On motion by Mr. Stephenson, it was

Ordered, That the Committee on Finance be directed to inquire into the expediency of requiring non-residents who come into this State for the purpose of purchasing articles of trade to be disposed of beyond the limits thereof, to take out license.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 12 and 15 of an Act passed at January Session, 1867, chapter 298, entitled an Act to incorporate the Pennsylvania Line Railroad Company, and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Being upon its second reading, was,

On motion by Mr. Biggs, ordered to lie over and be printed.

The bill entitled an Act to amend an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Parkton and Manchester Railroad Company, passed at the January Session, 1868,

Being upon its second reading, was, on motion by Mr. Stephenson, ordered to lie over and be printed.

The Senate proceeded to the consideration of Executive business, and after a time resumed the consideration of Legislative business.

The Senate adjourned.
