aid in the establishment of a Hospital in connection with the Washington University, of Baltimore, and to appropriate money for the same.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Timmons, from a Select Committee, reported a bill entitled an Act to repeal section 1, of Article 22, of the Public Local Laws, relating to the Alms House in Worcester county, and to enact a substitute therefor.

Which was read the first time.

The Committee on the part of the Senate and House of Delegates, to count the vote for Treasurer, returned to the Senate Chamber, and made the following report:

The vote cast by the House of Delegates, were, in number, eighty-six.

Of which number, John Merryman received fifty-four votes.

Robert Fowler received thirty-one votes.

Joshua Vansant received sixteen votes.

William F. Pannell received nine votes.

We therefore respectfully report, that neither of the nominees having received a majority of the vote cast, there is therefore no election.
