Which was read the first time, and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

And returned Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to furnish the Governor's Mansion, and appoint a Committee to superintend and control the disbursement of the same, and the purchase of the furniture.

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

The Senate bill entitled an Act supplemental to, and to amend an Act, entitled an Act to incorporate the Maryland Agricultural and Mechanical Association, passed March 19, 1867.

Was read the second time, and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

By unaminous consent,

Mr. Earle from the Committee on Finance, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act, to refund J. S. McCartney, of Hagerstown, Washington county, the sum of twenty-five dollars erroneously paid into the Treasury, reported it without amendment.

Said bill was then read the second time.
