

A bill entitled an Act to repeal and re-enact with amendments, section 45 of Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Revenue and Taxes," and to add two sections thereto.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finances.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 79, of Article 6, title "Caroline county," sub-title "Elections," of the Code of Public Local Laws, and to enact the following section in lieu thereof.

Which was read the first time and referred to Senators Fields, Hyland and Malone.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 958 and 959, of an Act entitled an Act to ratify the purchase, and to provide for the organizations and government of Druid Hill and Patterson Parks belonging to the City of Baltimore, by incorporating certain additional sections in Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, passed January session 1862, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Senators from Baltimore city.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal an Act passed January session 1867, entitled an Act to authorize the Pennsylvania Mutual Horse Thief Detecting and Insurance Company, of York, Pennsylvania, to transact business in the State of Maryland, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 18, of Article 16, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Chancery," sub-title "Auditor," and to re-enact the same so as to read as follows.
