Mr. Miller, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to whom was referred Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Baltimore county to complete the records in his office, and to provide new indices to the Land Records therein, and to provide the means for paying therefor, asked to be discharged from the further consideration thereof.

The petition of Thomas W. Kelly, John R. Basman and other citizens of district No. 2, in Somerset county, praying the passage of a prohibitory liquor law for said district.
