Ohio Railroad Company, from the payment of one-fifth of the gross receipts on the Washington Branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad, upon the payment of all arrearages due to the State by virtue of the Act of 1832, chapter 175.

On motion by Mr. Garroll,

Said Resolutions were ordered to be postponed until Thursday next, March 3rd, 1870, at 1 o'clock, and made the order of the day.

Mr. Clarke called up the Joint Resolutions submitted by him in relation to the appointment of Commissioners on the part of the State to audit, adjust and settle with the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company, the mutual accounts between the State and said Company.

Mr. Carroll moved that said Resolutions be postponed until Thursday next, the 3rd proximo, at 1 o'clock.

Mr. Clark demanded the yeas and nays.
