

Reported it with the following amendment:

Amend by inserting after the word "Executor," in the 7th line of the 15th section, the words, Administrator with the will annexed.

Which was adopted.

The section as amended, was then read and adopted.

Said bill as amended, was then read the second time.

Also,

From the same Committee, to whom was referred the House bill entitled an Act to add new sections to Article 51, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Justices of the Peace," as amended by the Act of 1868, chapter 443,

Reported it without amendments.

Said bill was then read the second time.

Mr Earle, from the Committee on Finance, to whom the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 302, of the Act of the General Assembly of 1868, entitled an Act to provide for refunding money paid into the State Treasury.

Which was read the first time.

Mr. Earle moved that the bill be read the second time this day.
