Leave was granted to Senators Wilson, Browne and Snyder, to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal so much of section 45, of chapter 330, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Prince George's county," under head of "Collectors," as relates to the publication of lists of delinquent tax-payers, and to add an additional section to said Act, providing for a deduction on county taxes paid directly to the County Treasurer within a stated period.
