Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The following bills having passed both branches of the General Assembly, were this day submitted to his Excellency, the Governor, for his approval.

An Act to amend the Act of 1853, chapter 194, entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad Company, and to repeal the second section of the Act of 1860, chapter 71, and to extend the time for the completion of the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad.

An Act to amend an Act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Parkton and Manchester Railroad Company," passed at the January session, A. D., 1868.

The question being upon the adoption of the unfavorable report of the Committee on Finance, on the House Joint Resolutions in reference to the claim of the State against the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad Company,
