

Mr. Carroll moved a suspension of the rules, in order to give the House bill entitled an Act to provide for maintaining and keeping in repair the public roads of Howard county, and to repeal the Act passed at the January session 1868, chapter 358, entitled an Act to provide for the repairs of the public roads in said county the third reading.
