district in Caroline county, to be styled district No. 6, or Andersontown district.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Senators from Caroline, Dorchester and Somerset counties.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 112, of the Act of the General Assembly of 1868, chapter 471, relating to the formation of corporations, and re-enact said section.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled an Act for the relief of John H. B. Latrobe, and authorizing the Appeal Tax Court of Baltimore city to correct errors with assessment of his property, in Baltimore city.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill entitled a Supplement to an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the Monumental Savings Institution, passed at the January session, 1868, chapter 125, and to change the name of said Institution to the Monumental Savings Bank, and to increase the capital stock thereof.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 138 of Article 16, of the Code of Public General Laws, title, "Chancery," subtitle, "Trustees," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

A bill entitled an Act to amend an Act passed at December session, 1845, chapter 37, entitled an Act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Washington, and the several Acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof.

A bill entitled an Act to add to Article 28, of the Code of Public General Laws, an additional section providing for the more effectual drainage of lands.

A bill entitled an Act to add additional sections to Article 26, of the Code of Public General Laws, as amended and passed at the January session, 1868, chapter 171, relating to corporations.
