AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend by striking out all that occurs after the word "error" in the 9th line, section 7, and insert in lieu thereof, the following:

And the Judges of the Appeal Tax Court of the City of Baltimore, shall give a certificate of such erroneous assessment to the person aggrieved, who shall present the same to the Mayor and City Council of said city, who are hereby authorized to make provisions to refund the amount thus paid in error, so far as the same relates to municipal taxes thus paid in error.
