The Senate bill entitled an Act for the more strict compliance of the State of Maryland with the provisions of an Act of Congress, approved July 2, 1862, entitled an Act donating public lands to the several States and Territories which may provide Colleges for the benefit of Agriculture and the Mechanic Arts,
