Said bill was then sent to the House of Delegates.

The following bills having passed both branches of the General Assembly, were this day presented to the Governor for his approval:

An Act to provide for the appointment of an additional Justice of the Peace in district number two, Hall's Cross Roads, in Harford county.

A supplement to an Act incorporating the Columbia and Port Deposit Rail Road Company.
