The House bill entitled an Act to authorize the Frederick and Pennsylvania Line Railroad Company to build a railroad from Frederick to Washington,

Mr. Miller, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to repeal section 18, of Article 51, of the Code of Public General Laws relating to the process issued by Justices of the Peace, and to re-enact the same with amendments, reported it without amendments.
