On motion by Mr. Earle,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Finance to report a bill to pay to M. A. Newell, Principal of Normal School, six hundred and twenty dollars, paid by him for clerk hire in preparing his report of the condition of the public schools to submit to the General Assembly.

Mr. Grove, from the Select Committee, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to prevent fishing in Antietam creek and its tributaries, from the Pennsylvania line to its mouth, reported it unfavorably,

And the report was adopted.

The Senate took up for consideration,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to require the Life Association of America to deposit certain bonds and mortgages with the Comptroller of the Treasury, and to provide for the better protection of the citizens of the State of Maryland.
