On the question being put,

It was determined in the affirmative.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 9, Article 38, of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Fees of Officers, passed March 18, 1865, and to enact the same with amendments,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion by Mr. Clarke, The Senate adjourned.

The Senate met pursuant to adjournment.

Leave was granted to Senators Henkle, Wilson and Clarke to introduce a bill to be entitled an Act for the relief of J. B. Magruder, late Inspector of Tobacco Warehouse No. 1, and of persons employed under him in said warehouse.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to increase the number of incorporators in an Act to incorporate the Westernport and Potomac Railroad Company, passed January session, 1853, chap. 219.
