Mr. Snyder asked and obtained the unanimous consent of the Senate to submit the following message:

The Senate bill entitled an Act to pay the claims of Henry Brooke, C. C. Magruder, Jr.. and J. N. W. Wilson, recommended by the Comptroller,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to enable the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to endorse or guarantee the first mortgage bonds of the Western Maryland Railroad Company to the amount of six hundred thousand dollars,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Galveston Steamship and Warehouse Company.

Was read the third time and passed by year and nays, as follows:
