The further consideration of said bill was postponed until to-morrow at 12 o'clock.

Mr. Clarke, from the Select Committee to whom the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled an Act to prevent the sale of spirituous liquors within one mile of Warren Factory, in Baltimore county.

Which was read the first time.

On motion by Mr. Clarke,

The Senate adjourned.

Senate met pursuant to adjournment.
