Also, from the same Committee, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to incorporate the St. Paul's Savings Bank of Baltimore, reported it without amendment.

Mr. Earle, from the Committee on Finance, to whom the leave was granted, reported a bill entitled an Act to authorize the Comptroller and Treasurer to dispose of certain State's stock, with the approbation of the Governor.

Which was read the first time.

Also, from the same Committee, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act making appropriations for the support of the Government for the year ending January 1, 1872, reported it with the following amendments:

Under head of "Baltimore City," line 11, after the word "Academy," strike out "fifteen hundred dollars" and insert seven hundred and fifty dollars, and to J. M. Gramlich the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars for the use of the German Catholic School of Cumberland.
