Which was read the first time and referred to the Senators from Frederick, Baltimore and Anne Arundel counties.

A bill entitled an Act to enable the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to endorse the first mortgage bonds of the Lynchburg and Danville Railroad Company, to the amount of \$750,000.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Senators from Baltimore city.

Mr. Denson moved that said bill be read the second time this day.
