The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal the Act of 1868, chapter 406, entitled an Act to repeal the Act of 1867, chapter 184, entitled an Act to repeal Article 71, of the Code of Public General Law, entitled "Oysters," and to re-enact the same with amendments,

Mr. Henry submitted the following amendments:

In section 12, line 5, strike out the word "therein," and insert thereof in lieu of it.

In section 16, line 5, after county insert the words or lying between two or more counties.

In section 30, line 4, after the word "Article," insert the words or any oysters growing on any grounds appropriated according to the provisions of said sections.
