

amounts of such bonds upon which payment may be demanded.

Amend title of the bill by adding thereto the words: And to provide for the sale of certain stocks of the State to pay the holders of said bonds who may demand payment thereof.

The Committee of Conference of the two Houses on the disagreeing votes of the Senate and House of Delegates on the House bill numbered 236, recommend that the Senate recede from the amendment adopted by the Senate, and that the House bill be passed with the foregoing amendments.
