Mr. Martin submitted the following message :

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,
February 1, 1870.

Gentlemen of the Senate :

We propose, with the concurrence of your Honorable Body, the appointment of a Joint Special Committee, consisting of four members of this House, and three members of the Senate, to whom shall be referred all matters of account in dispute between the State of Maryland and the Baltimore and
