Ordered, That five thousand copies of the Oyster Law just passed by the Legislature be immediately printed and delivered to the Secretary of the Senate; one thousand copies to be distributed to members of the Legislature; one thousand copies to the Comptroller of the Treasury; one thousand copies to the Commander of the State Oyster Police force, and two thousand copies to the Clerks of the Circuit Courts for the tide-water counties, for general distribution among those interested in the Oyster trade.
