AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

1st. In section 1, line 3, strike out the words "Anne Arundel County," and insert in lieu thereof the words: The State of Maryland.

2d. In section 2, line 3, strike out the words "Anne Arundel County," and insert in lieu thereof, the words: The State of Maryland.

3d. Amend title by striking out the words "Waters of the Chesapeake Bay and Tributaries," and insert the words: Rivers, Creeks and Coves, in lieu thereof.

Which were severally read and adopted.

Said bill was then read the second time.
