Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 1 and 4 of chapter 31, of the Code of Public General Laws, passed January session, 1865, and to repeal section 102, of chapter 44, of the law passed by the Legislature of Maryland, 1868, in relation to the publication of the General Laws, and re-enact a section for the uniform price for publishing the Public General Laws,

Endorsed, "Read the third time and rejected for want of a constitutional majority by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled an Act for the protection of the owners of land bordering upon the Chesapeake bay and its tributaries,

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled an Act to amend the charter of Snow Hill, in Worcester county,

Endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays," with proposed amendment,

Section 130, line 1, strike out "male white voters," and insert legal voters.
