The Senate proceeded to the consideration of Executive business, and after a time resumed the consideration of Legislative business.

Mr. Miller, from the Committee on Judicial Proceedings, to whom was referred House bill entitled an Act to amend Article 36, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Estray," by adding additional sections thereto, reported it without amendments.

Said bill was then read the second time.

The House bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel county, to correct the assessment of certain real estate in said county, and to refund taxes paid in error,

Was read the third time and passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
