AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Amend section 412 by the addition of the following words, to be added at its close:

And in case the purchase shall be made of an agent of any person or persons residing outside of the State of Maryland, manufacturing, compounding, preparing or furnishing for sale within the limits of said State, any such commercial manure, the purchaser thereof shall have his option to proceed by attachment, as now provided by law in cases of non-residents and absconding debtors, against any property
