

of the county wherein said default may exist, by suit or warrant, as the case may be, and the Justice of the Peace and appraisers hereinbefore provided for, shall be entitled to the same compensation as now provided by law for similar services in other cases; *provided*, that the tax herein mentioned shall not be construed to apply to incorporated towns wherein a similar tax is imposed.

Stealing dog.

Guilty of felony.

Sec. 11. *And be it enacted*, That if any person shall feloniously steal, take or carry away any dog, the property of another, in either of the aforesaid counties of this State, he shall be liable to presentment and indictment by the grand jury of the county wherein he may have committed the said offence, and upon conviction thereof in the Circuit Court for the said county, shall be deemed guilty of felony, and shall be sentenced by the said Court to the penitentiary of this State for not less than twelve months nor more than two years, in the discretion of the said Court.

Sec. 12. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 190.

AN ACT to repeal Section one of Chapter four hundred and forty-two, of the Laws passed at January Session, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, to prevent the hauling of seines over one hundred fathoms in length in Synapuxent Bay, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Not to haul seine.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section one of Chapter four hundred and forty-two, of the Laws passed January Session, eighteen hundred and sixty-eight, entitled "An Act to prevent the hauling of any seine or seines over one hundred fathoms in length in Synapuxent Bay, or any of the bays or their tributaries on the eastern side side of Worcester County above George's Island Landing," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows :
